Public Comments/Membership News:

Charlie Mitchell shared that Brown City Public Library has officially become a district library. He and the team leading this transition are seeking advice from any other members who have recently navigated the process.

Jeanette Morrish, Fleschner Memorial Library, inquired about the possibility of a summer library passport program wherein patrons could collect stamps from different WPLC libraries as they travel the state. Jenn Donner, Iosco-Arenac District Library, shared that her branches had done a similar program amongst themselves recently and would be able to share their experience running a similar event.

Jeanette Leathorn, Ogemaw District Library, shared that her location had set up active shooter training during their November staff meeting, and it was a great success. She suggested that other libraries reach out to their public safety contacts and consider doing the same.

Vicki Mazure, Harbor Beach Area District Library, shared that their location has officially opened a fitness center and membership program for the public. She shared that the service was one that the community had asked for and that their unique building provided the opportunity to fill that need.

Amy Beckman, Millington Arbella District Library, shared a community event that they've had great success with. During Christmas in the Village, two therapy dogs came to visit the location and visit with families. Over 400 people attend the event.

Jenn Donner offered a programming recommendation that was well received by their community. The presenter offered information about UFOs and related events covered in a recent episode of Netflix's Unsolved Mysteries. She offered to provide the contact information for the presenter to anyone interested in having them visit their location.

Erin Schmandt, Caro Area District Library, shared the turnout of her location's recent Board elections and expressed optimism about the results.

Lorrie Taylor, Alma Public Library, had a great turnout for a holiday photo event that they held. They had 176 families sign up for 175 slots with a professional photographer for a free picture with Santa. In total, approximately 400 people attended which included many new faces.

Outreach Services

Erin Schmandt attended the 2022 Association of Bookmobile and Outreach Services Conference in Scottsdale, Arizona. Caro Area District Library recently had a custom golf cart bookmobile made, but Erin also noted how useful the sessions were even if a library didn't own one. The conversations had with other attendees who experience challenges rural libraries face were incredibly beneficial. The Library of Michigan provided a stipend that allowed her to make the trip, and she reported that the experience was overwhelmingly positive. The 2023 conference is set to be in Hershey, PA, and Erin recommended that anyone interested look into it.

MLA Annual Conference Insights

Briynne McCrea, Bad Axe Area District Library, shared her experience at the MLA 2022 Annual Conference in Port Huron. The keynote presentation from the founders of The Civility Project discussed how to communicate with people you may not agree with, and their presentation stood out to her as being particularly excellent. She also attended a breakout session about the Transformation of the Flint Public Library. The story shared by their director was a masterclass on managing the challenges that public libraries have to face and inspired many attendees.
